Bananas have been at the heart of Fairtrade since they appeared on our shelves 13 years ago, and there's now over 1.2 billion Fairtrade bananas sold in the UK each year. But with still only 1 in 3 bananas in British shops sold as Fairtrade we still have a long way to go and there remains a serious problem at the heart of the banana business.

That's why Fairtrade Fortnight 2014 marks the launch of a special campaign that aims to transform the banana industry to ensure those at the sharp end of the supply chain, the millions of struggling banana farmers and workers, get a fair deal.

Bristol has won the bid to host the International Fairtrade Towns Conference in 2015

Bristol gained overwhelming support from Fairtrade Co-ordinators from around the world for our bid, due to the international reputation of our Fairtrade campaigning and enthusiasm for linking the Conference to our European Green Capital events and celebrations in 2015.

The Conference will take place 4th-5th July 2015 and will involve approximately 400 delegates from around the world. Hosting this Conference will enhance Bristol's reputation as a green and ethical city and leading tourist destination.

2015 will mark 10 years since Bristol became a Fairtrade City, and hosting this Conference is a perfect way to celebrate what has been achieved in this time.
