

was outside his modest home. The ground began to shake. He realised what was happening and yelled to his wife Pushpo to come outside. As she tried to get out she lost her footing and slipped. She grabbed the doorway for support but the house collapsed on top of her. She was killed instantly.

Khrishna passed out and only regained consciousness an hour later. He had suffered a horrific trauma. His dear wife was dead.

Khrishna contracted leprosy many years ago when he was a teenage boy but, because it wasn't diagnosed and treated quickly, the disease caused permanent damage to his

and helped him manage at home, as well as being by his side for 25 years. Now his home and all that he owned was in ruins. Even the milk buffalo that earned the family a meagre living was under the rubble.

Overcome with despair, Khrishna wanted to die too. It was only the tearful pleas of his sons Kamal, 12 and Ashok, 18, that stopped him from killing himself. Now, Khrishna is determined to look after his sons, even if that means begging to survive. He desperately needs a new home – a safe place to raise his youngest son.

# Families need to rebuild their lives



On 25 April 2015 a powerful 7.8 magnitude earthquake struck the central region of Nepal, shortly followed by another. It left a trail of death and devastation, killing almost 9,000 people, including 2,500 children, and destroying or damaging more than a million homes.

In its immediate aftermath injured people flocked to The Leprosy Mission hospital in Anandaban where your generous donations provided thousands of people with surgery, treatment for fractures and wounds, emergency food supplies and tin sheets for temporary shelters.

The hospital, the only one for miles around, suffered some structural damage and the homes of dozens of doctors, nurses and support staff were either completely or partially destroyed.

In the villages, where stone and mud houses once stood there are now piles of rubble.

People affected by leprosy have been especially hard hit

Already the poorest of the poor, many lost their livelihoods and their homes. Tragically some families also lost their loved ones.

Winter is coming. People whose lives have been devastated are shivering in the cold and rain in make-shift shelters. These shelters do not last long and cannot protect people from the worst of the winter weather. Until they have a home these families cannot start to rebuild their lives.

Nepal has dropped from the headlines but the people there remain in great need – people who are already disabled by leprosy are destitute. They desperately need your support.
